## **Presidents Message:**

On behalf of H.E. Sakya Jetsun Chimey Luding (Jetsun Kushok) and all of us here, we would like to wish you a very special, prosperous and peaceful New Year of the Wood Monkey!

2003 was a very busy and successful year for SKC. So much so that I never had time to get the newsletter out! But, here it is and it's full of exciting news, interesting comments from retreaters and ideas on how to participate.

## 2003 Highlights

**February:** An auspicious start with Khenpo Lungrik of Bir Monastery. With him came Lama Jamyang, an accomplished Tangka painter and wonderful cook and Chimey a fantastic translator who was precise and fluid. Khenpo gave two public talks. One on the significance of the Tibetan Temple and the other on the guru/disciple relationship. He also gave two beginning meditation classes, the empowerments of Red Sarasvati and Yellow Jambhala and led the Green Tara practice every morning.

**March:** Jetsun Kushok gave her annual Green Tara retreat. This has become a retreat that brings students back each year to deepen their practice of Green Tara. To be able to spend undistracted time with a teacher such as Jetsun Kushok, who is in high demand all over the world, was an incredible blessing.

**June:** Geshe Jamyang Tsultrim gave his annual meditation retreat, focusing on Shamatha and Vipassana. Practice sessions were balanced with instruction and question



and answer periods. His thorough and accessible teaching methods have gained a solid group of students here on San Juan Island.

**July:** H.E. Luding Khenchen Rinpoche, one of Jetsun Kushok's root gurus, came and gave Lojong teachings, a talk on the Sakya lineage, bodhisattva vows and Manjushri and Vajrapani empowerments. H.E. is the 75th Head of the Ngor sub-sect of the Sakya tradition and was enthroned in 1954. His contributions to the Dharma have been vast, including giving the precious Lam Dre teachings 15 times.

**July:** Jetsun Kushok returned to give a weekend Manjushri retreat. continued...

**August:** The Gaden Shartse monks of the Gelugpa school came through with their yearly Sacred Earth and Healing Arts tour. While here they provided a very special presence as they gave house blessings, healings and astrological readings.

**September:** Ms. Leslie Di Russo, visiting here from NYC, gave a slide show and lecture featuring selected photographs from the Heinrich Harrer (Seven Years in Tibet) collection of original photographs taken by him while in Tibet.

#### 2004 and Beyond Preview:

- March 26-29 Jetsun Kushok will give a Green Tara retreat
- Late June or sometime in July Jetsun Kushok will give a foundation practices retreat.
- On-going classes have recently begun with Geshe Jamyang Tsultrim on Shamatha and Vipassana meditation and Buddhist philosophy. This group meets quarterly with Geshe Jamyang and every two weeks as a self study group. The group is open to all, but due to the nature of the course, coming on a drop-in basis is not possible. This course is scheduled on a yearly basis and another one will begin next January.
- Pema Chodron Shambhala teaching tapes group. This group meets here on Sundays at 3:00 p.m. Current course is "Going To the Places That Scare You". This program addresses learning to practice with fear, aversion and suffering in the context of the great motivation to benefit others. This group does not require a commitment and is open to all. Drop-ins welcome during the course of 5 weeks.
- Dharma Video Night continues on the last Sunday of the month, 7:00 p.m. at the library.
- Green Tara practice every Sunday at 11:30 a.m.
- Shamatha meditation practice every Sunday from 1:30 till 2:30 p.m.
- Notice of other events for 2004 will be sent as dates, etc. become firm.
